Everyday Business Purposes	The actions necessary by financial companies to run their business and manage customer accounts, such as providing investment advisory and financial planning advice, processing securities transactions, and otherwise providing financial services to you.	
Affiliates	Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. MCFA has the following affiliates: • Midwest Capital Resources, Inc.	
Non-Affiliates	Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. MCFA does not share information with non-affiliates for marketing

 Joint
 A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial Marketing

 products or services to you. MCFA does not engage in joint marketing with non-affiliates.
